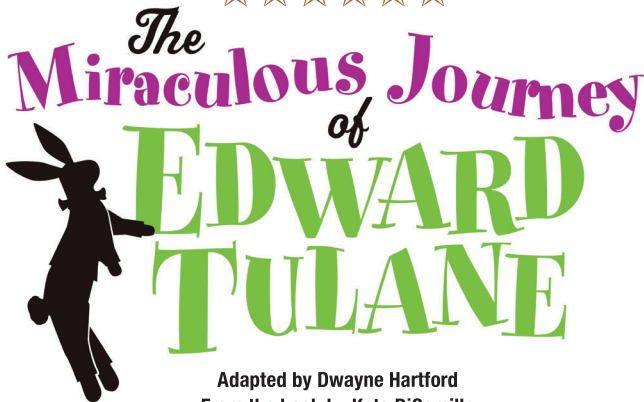

As years pass by, Edward meets many different people in many different situations: an older grieving couple who find comfort in Edward's presence, a hobo and his dog who introduce Edward to a whole community of homeless wanderers, a farmer in need of a scarecrow, a sad little boy and his very ill sister, and finally a doll mender and an old doll who teach Edward an invaluable lesson. Through this miraculous journey, Edward learns what it is to love, what it is to lose that love, and how to find the courage to love again. CASTING

Seeking a Company (actors and production crew) of approximately 30 youth (for onstage roles and production crew opportunities which may include Props, Costumes/Makeup, Paint, Lighting, Sound, and a Scenery Building crew) ages 9 through a Senior in High School. Students must have turned 9 on or before the day of the first rehearsal. (Monday, October 1st)

REQUIREMENTS

Those wishing to audition are required to register in advance for either the **Sunday, September 23rd** or **Monday, September 24th** audition date. By registering in advance you will receive your audition paperwork, as well as, all pertinent information via email prior to the auditions.

- A parent or guardian is required to attend the first half hour of auditions.
- Those auditioning for onstage roles will be asked to read from the script.
- Those auditioning for crew positions will be asked to listen to designer presentations, speak to designers/technicians, and indicate interest for specific crews.
